8 Plan for evacuation

If you live in a high-risk area, be prepared to evacuate quickly. Have a plan in place, including:

A designated meeting spot for your family or household members

A list of important phone numbers, including emergency contacts and a family member or friend who lives outside the affected area

A map of evacuation routes and shelter locations

A plan for your pets, including extra food, water, and a crate or carrier

During the Storm (if evacuation is necessary):

Follow evacuation orders: If you are instructed to evacuate, do so immediately. Do not wait until the last minute to leave, as roads may become congested and dangerous.

Take your emergency kit: Be sure to bring your emergency kit with you, as well as any necessary medications, important documents, and supplies for your pets.

Stay informed: Listen to local news and weather updates to stay informed about the storm's progress and any evacuation orders or other important information.

5 During the Storm (if evacuation is not necessary):

Stay inside your home or business during the storm, and avoid going outside unless absolutely necessary.

Stay away from windows and doors: If possible, stay in an interior room without windows or doors.

Keep your emergency kit handy: Keep your emergency kit nearby in case of power outages or other disruptions.

Stay informed: Listen to local news and weather updates to stay informed about the storm's progress and any important information.

6 After the Storm:

Be cautious when returning to your home or business after the storm has passed. Be sure to check for any structural damage or flooding, and follow any instructions from local authorities regarding re-entry and cleanup.

Take pictures of your entire property to assist with your insurance claim. Call your adjuster to report loss, and contact a property damage restoration company like R&L Global Inc for damage assessment.
